Annual Meeting Notes: At the voters' assembly meeting last Sunday, the voters elected Justin Kannas (treasurer), Jim Buffington (trustee) and Kent Larson (elder). They approved a budget for 2024 and set our congregational mission offering subscription at \$32,000. They also approved 2024 distribution percentages from the Bailey Family Trust. A recommendation from the Planned Giving Committee to distribute \$2500 from the Trust Fund for the Evangelism Committee was also approved.
